Discussion+Reflection+Sharing - Bell Ringers - I do/You do/We do – Timers – Tips for Sanity – Partners – Groups - Lost



Critical Discussion, Reflection, Sharing



- O Tech Sharing and discussion time
 - for a short block of time each week, at the end of the period, or during identified class times
- Ask students to share new things they have learned with classmates
- Reflect on what went well, what could be improved next time, actions and ideas to implement
- Have students explain how and when they followed legal and ethical standards of use with examples (cited source, checked the source...)
- Have students share how to be appropriate in online 'social' use, in and out of the school setting, could even role play it out



EYES ON ME

• Ask 3 before me

• Teach students that **"Shark jaw"** – means to partially close the computer half way.

• Get up and move around the room frequently, monitoring their screens, asking or answering questions, guiding their use of the technologies to stay on task. Establish a login procedure + Where to keep their username and password safely

Timers with built-in Pomodoro Breaks

- At the beginning of each day select the tasks you need to complete and put them on a todo list.
- Start working.
- Start the Pomodoro timer.
- Work until the Pomodoro rings.
- Take a short break (three-five minutes).
- Keep on working, Pomodoro after Pomodoro, until the task at hand is finished. Every four Pomodoros take a longer break, (15–30 minutes).


Working With Partners

- Work with Partners with complementary abilities or skills levels
- O Refer to a poster or set of expectations for collaboration
- Have them reflect on what went well and what could be improved
- Teach them how share and work on a document together
- O Identify behaviors that are supportive of working with a partner
- Discuss roles, feedback, and the valuing of the ideas and opinions of others

Small groups

O Students number off 1-2-3-4

- O Then call the 1's and teach them something to teach the others in their group
- Can teach each set of numbered students a different technology skill to share and show the others.




Lost or in 'need of assistance' ?

O Have one or more students that are tech helpers

O Use the Colored cups or a signal system (flags, colored index cards...)

- Supply the cups at each seat, students put green on top unless help is needed.
- O Red on top means need help
- Yellow on top need 'helper' student or lost their way
- O Green on top all is well

O Ask 3 before me to clarify or repeat directions
